

## Visual Analysis

The photos that accompany "A League of Their Own" include pictures of documents. Taking photos of documents can pose a challenge for authors writing an article because they need to make sure the photos are as interesting to look at as they are informative. In this exercise you will think about how you would make pieces of paper interesting to look at?

For this exercise, compare two different ways of showing documents. Look at the L'Monar certificate and the image of Peggy Karem holding a picture of her father. Think about how the two photos differ. Why do you think the photographer chose the different approaches? (For more examples, you can also consider the image of a page from the team's scorebook, and of someone holding a photo of the team.) Answer the following questions:

- Which type of photo do you prefer?
- Why do you prefer it?
- What other ways might a photographer deal with the challenge of showing paper documents?
